
Photo Walk July 30th

As part of Thembinkosi Hlatshwayo's residency, he hosted a Photo Walk in the Allapatah neighborhood, which invited participants to explore themes of trauma, displacement, and personal intuition through discussion and photography. Each participant was given a numbered slip of paper with a prompt and was asked to write their response. For example, "Respond to a memory of a loved one" or "respond to the mundanity of everyday life." After participants wrote their responses, their answers were randomly exchanged with the other participants. Equipped with their personal photography gear or disposable film cameras, the group was then led into the neighborhood surrounding El Espacio 23 and instructed to interpret their peers' answers through photography. Each participant has a photo displayed from their photo walk, offering a layered visual narrative shaped by both their own perspective and someone else's story. The resulting images reflect a collective exploration of memory and place, blurring the lines between observer and subject, and underscoring the power of art to translate shared human experiences into visual form.
